PACE-Net Plus Conference, Bremen, Germany (9-11 September)

- Non-communicable diseases (NCDs) are currently recognized by WHO as the leading cause of death in the world.
- The four major NCDs upon which this Think Tank largely focused are: **cardiovascular diseases (CVDs), chronic respiratory diseases, cancers, and type two diabetes mellitus (hereafter diabetes).**

2. Main Outcomes

Situational analysis

- Wide range of public initiatives across the (South) Pacific region.
- One-size-fits-all approaches are unlikely to be successful.
- Strong interest from both Pacific and EU in research collaboration - first step is understanding of current situation.



2. Main Outcomes

Situational analysis

- ‘Strengths’ may simultaneously be ‘Weaknesses’:
eg.: country size.
- Lack of resources (money, human resources, evaluation and surveillance).
- Main challenges:
 - turning policy statements and commitments into real actions;
 - achieving multi-sectoral cooperation;
 - engaging local communities;
 - improving communication between stakeholders.

Requires monitoring and evaluation and health impact assessment (HIA) of cross-sectoral policies including trade agreements • Development of relevant evidence for Pacific islands, with global significance 	<u>Food Policy</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Health impact assessment of trade agreements and cross-sectoral policies • Development for key food policy interventions (building evidence base) • Public health advocacy institute for the Pacific

<u>Community informed and led action</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase focus on community-based NCD intervention studies • Provide provision of prevention and treatment via primary health care 	<u>Community informed and led action</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strengthening civil society organizations • Build on existing structures and traditional systems

<u>Research</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Harmonization of research priorities and cooperation • Accessibility of research opportunities and findings • Turning research into action and holding policy makers accountable 	<u>Research</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stronger focus and resource allocation for NCD related research • Culturally appropriate and national prioritized research • Build research capacity and dissemination within the EU and Pacific

<u>Data and surveillance</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approach to policy development based on evidence and data • Monitor progress of quality of data across a range of domains • Use and translation of data into powerful messages to drive policy and change 	<u>Data and surveillance</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Build a regional COD coding facility • Create an ICT platform for improved access to NCD data and knowledge • Build regional innovative accountability frameworks – support Pacific Monitoring Alliance for NCD Action (Pacific MANA)
